FISHERS OF PEOPLE

In many churches they have recently read the passage of scripture where Jesus is calling the Disciples to be fishers of men and women. I know nothing about fishing, but I have heard there are different kinds. There's river bank fishing, fly fishing, trawling, net fishing, sea fishing, and TROUT TICKLING! (Experts will know more types and the proper names!)

If being called by Jesus to be 'fishers of people' means outreach and evangelism, what kinds of fishing techniques are we using in our churches?

Are we sitting happily on a river bank (or in our churches) allowing the people to come to us, but not really getting involved where they are in their environment? Are we fly fishing? Showing something attractive, but not real and deep like friendship? (People aren't looking for friendly churches, they are looking for churches where they can make friends) Or are we doing big missions which trawl for everyone, but are insensitive to the impact, and throw back those who don't fit in?

I hope none of these are descriptive of our evangelism. I think people who fish in all weather are impressive. They don't mind getting cold and wet and patiently spending a long time with nothing happening. I also think that 'Trout Tickling' despite its funny name, has a lot to teach us about being 'fishers of people'. Trout tickling means getting INTO the water and letting your hands become as cold as the water so the fish can't tell the difference of heat. The person fishing becomes part of the river, even if they are not

from the river. I expect fingers get wrinkly, feet get cold and back aches, but the fish come to trust the person fishing.

Evangelism is never to be predatory or deceptive, but to bring people into a safe relationship with Jesus. Let's actually climb down into the river!

THE LANGUAGE OF LOVE

Valentine's Day reminds us of the importance of expressing our love to those close to us. But how can we go beyond simply offering flowers and a card? Jesus says: '*A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another*' (John 13:34). How can we express love like Jesus in our everyday relationships to our partner, children, neighbours or work colleagues?

Listening

We need to listen to others, just as Jesus did. He asked questions of people and waited for them to process their answer. According to James, '*everyone should be quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry*' (James 1:19). How well do we listen to others? How often do we find ourselves already thinking of what we want to say before somebody's finished speaking? Listening takes time; don't rush it!

Touching

Jesus reached out to touch the untouchables in His world, including lepers, the sick and children. This was completely out of character for rabbis of His day. For us today, a warm handshake may be of value. Of course, it should always be an *appropriate* touch – helpful for the other person, not just for ourselves.

Speaking

Jesus' conversation was always full of grace and truth (John 1:14). Do we speak words of *grace*, by offering comfort, giving encouragement or expressing care and concern? However, we should also be ready to speak words of *truth*, in asking for forgiveness, seeking reconciliation or addressing conflict. As Paul urges us, don't avoid: '*speaking the truth in love*'.

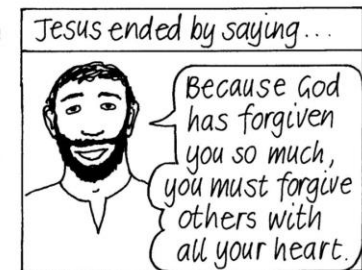
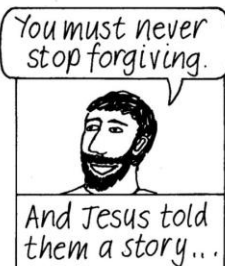

HEMEL HEMPSTEAD CHILD CONTACT CENTRE

MARCH 1991-DECEMBER 2022

Thirty-three years ago Songs of Praise featured an Access Centre (as it was called then) which had opened in Nottingham, by a Solicitor by the name of Mary Lower, where children meet with parents following separation. From that first access centre many more opened across the country and internationally. Access centres have since changed the name to Child Contact Centres. I saw an episode on Songs of Praise, at the time I was hosting, a friend and her children, at my house every Saturday, From my own childhood experience, I rarely went out with my Father, after my Parents divorce, so contact was eventually lost. NNBBBB

I felt God speaking to me in a dream, with the idea to have a Contact Centre at Carey Baptist Church. I presented the idea at the Church meeting, to my amazement the Church accepted the idea. It took a year to set up the centre, which included a visit to the Milton Keynes centre. Hilary Donovan who had been a social worker, became the co-ordinator along with the help of the late Dennis Hogan, taking up the position of Chairman.

The facilities at Carey allowed us space for the children to play. along with ample storage for all the toys which entertained the Children, and helped to break the ice when meetings took place for the first time.

Over the years we've seen many volunteers assisting at the Centre. A huge thank you is extended to all of them for giving up their time and supporting the Centre in so many ways, enabling the centre to function on the 1st and 3rd Saturday of the Month.

Hilary worked tirelessly as co-ordinator for many years, along with a strong support team from Carey. The Centre has seen a number of changes over its 32 Years and its difficult to look back at the help and support it has given to so many families over the Years. After a number of meetings looking at the viability of the Centre to Function, with the low number of Volunteers, reduced Money being made available, and the type of referrals

being offered, meant that the Centre was not a viable proportion, so the Centre had its last meeting in December 2022.

This year's campaign will highlight the message that whatever your budget and wherever you shop, when you choose Fairtrade, you support farmers to take care of the environment through Fairtrade's Price, Premium and Programmes.

The two-week annual celebrity-backed campaign runs from 27 February – 12 March. This year it will focus on the climate crisis and the increasing threat it poses to some of the planet's most beloved food products as well as the livelihoods of the farmers and agricultural workers who grow them. It will show how the future survival of the world's most popular foods – such as bananas, cocoa, and coffee – hangs in the balance unless we achieve inclusive and equitable climate solutions, with farmers and agricultural workers playing a central role in the climate response.

Transform Trade

(formerly Traidcraft Exchange, the charity wing of Traidcraft)

By now you may have heard the news: Traidcraft, the fair trade pioneer and our close partner for many years, is going into administration.... Many of you will have supported Traidcraft for years and do not need me to tell you that today marks a huge loss. After an exceptionally difficult few years, one of the founders of the trade justice movement is closing its doors.

Since 1979 Traidcraft has reimagined the relationships between producers and consumers, putting justice at the heart of trade. It's no exaggeration to say that the fair trade movement as we know it would not exist without Traidcraft. **But what now?**

When we changed our name to Transform Trade, Richard Adams, the founder of Traidcraft said...*“Transform Trade have picked up the baton with their new strategy and name... the work is not done yet.”*

We didn't realise at the time just how relevant those words would be, only a few months down the line. Together, we must pick up the baton. The good work that Traidcraft has done over the years will not disappear. Instead it must be built upon.

Our mission is to transform trade so that everybody benefits. As we continue this work, our focus right now is on two things.

1. Supporting producers

Over the years, Traidcraft did incredible work with smaller producer groups – helping them find a route to market where no one else could. We're working on plans to expand our work supporting small groups of artisans and farmers, like those Traidcraft was originally set up to help, in order to fill the gap they leave behind.

2. The system

Trading ethically within a system that is unjust is always going to be difficult – especially during a cost-of-living crisis. From the start, the odds were stacked against Traidcraft. Our campaigning and advocacy work aims to level the playing field by demanding change to the entire trading system. We've shown in the past that it can be done, but we must press on with renewed energy.

I firmly believe that there is hope for the trade justice movement. The good work that Traidcraft pioneered cannot and will not be undone. We are committed to transforming trade – and I am so grateful that you stand with us.

As the Head of Finance at Transform Trade, I don't often write emails like this. I prefer to focus on the numbers, making sure your money flows effectively to the people we work with across the world. **But last week,**

Traidcraft announced it was going into administration - and I simply had to email you. While they are a separate organisation to us, they've been a partner for many years and now we need to step up.

I wanted to talk plainly about the financial implications this news has for Transform Trade. Simply put we have a gap in our budget of around £220,000 because of the closure - roughly 6% of our operating costs in a year. **This is serious because in Traidcraft's absence we need to do more, not less. One thing that helps us expand our work in uncertain times like these is regular gifts from supporters like you.....Regular givers to Transform Trade have helped millions of people get a better deal from trade - even a small gift adds up to big change.** Together, as a global community, we can build on the legacy of Traidcraft and open up new opportunities for producers around the world. The work continues.....

HISTORY-MAKING MISSION



BMS workers Pete and Lou make mission history with Pastors Nandita and Jyoti!

In November 2022, the Bangladesh Baptist Church Sangha (BBCS) gathered to mark the 225-year anniversary of BMS World Mission founder William Carey's arrival in Bengal. More than 3,000

Bangladeshi Baptists came together to celebrate this milestone, along with BMS General Director Kang-San Tan, Head of BMS Trustees Marc Owen, and BMS workers Louise and Peter Lynch.

The theme chosen for the anniversary was Revelation 2: 25, which looks towards our future hope as believers: "...hold on to what you have been given until I come." As Louise explained, "The whole idea of the celebration is to go forward, looking into how we can share the gospel even more successfully across Bangladesh!"

A hugely exciting part of this for BBCS was the work Louise and Peter have been doing behind the scenes with BBCS to prepare the way for the ordination of their first female pastors, Jyoti Ratner and Nandita Sharker! As the Lynches shared in their November prayer letter:

"Jyoti and Nandita are our friends and we have seen their patient service irrespective of recognition. So, it has been really good to have been part of the behind-the-scenes team within BBCS working towards this day, and to pray for these women as they develop, train and support the next generation. The very public inclusion and affirmation of these women also, I think, communicated something about how BBCS leadership wants to be."

225 years on, our understanding of mission has changed and so has the church in Bangladesh. As Kang-San put it, "Jesus Christ's sacrifice is available for all, young and old, female and male to participate fully in the leadership of the church."
